

After the construction of the numerous speed humps in Milnerton Drive some motorists have taken to using **Fairview Crescent** , a road that has no stop streets or speed humps. This has created a dangerous situation as some cars speed along this road.

Before applying to the council for suitable traffic calming measures to implemented on Fairview Crescent, we will give residents the opportunity to have their say in an online survey.

vagrancy

The issue of trying to curb the influx of vagrants into our suburb and surrounds is an ongoing task.

Residents have complained of loitering and public drinking taking place at the Gallery shopping centre especially over weekends. The MRRA has contacted the Gallery centre management regarding this and received the following information:

The fencing at the back of the centre will be extended so that no sleeping can occur under the stairs. The centre is also changing their security company in an effort to improve the controlling of the centre and surrounding area.

The waste recycling initiative by CleanC is having a positive effect regarding the bin pickers on Monday mornings. The number of bin pickers may not have reduced, but the time they spend in Milnerton Ridge is less as a fair number of bins now do not have any recyclable material in them.

The park below the Paddocks centre falls under the Royal Ascot management (RAMPOA). The issue of vagrants there is always an item at the monthly Environmental management committee (EMC) meeting. Residents are urged to contact law enforcement or Crime Watch if vagrants are noticed to be sleeping there.

Dr Joy McCarthy mentioned that beggars at the Racecourse Rd/R27 intersection will continue to be there as long as motorists provide handouts. She urged all to rather support the Give Responsibly campaign and support an institution of their choice.

Other Issues

The **Lions Club** house roof is being cleaned prior to being repainted. The concern regarding asbestos contamination due to a high pressure hose being used was raised. We passed this concern onto the Lions and were assured that they are aware of the danger, but that the asbestos roof does have a sealant covering under the paint and they do not see any contamination danger.



The non-painted state of the repaired wall at the **corner of Fairview Cr/Milnerton Drive** does not give a good impression when entering Milnerton Ridge. We will approach the residents to paint the wall. An offer of donating paint was even made by one resident.

The possibility of placing a mirror at the **corner of Fairview Cr near Fairview Close** to increase visibility at that corner was raised again. RS has approached council for this.

Paddocks park watering: Residents have noticed that the parks are being watered outside the council watering schedule. RAMPOA has applied for and received an exemption to do watering outside the watering schedule.



The possibility of connecting the water supply for the parks to the recycled water supply was investigated by the EMC, but found not feasible due to excessive nutrients in this water not being compatible with the type of plants in the park.



Rietvlei






